Livability Coalition Directory: Introduction

Partners for Livable Communities is proud to commemorate its thirtieth anniversary with the publication of this roster of “livability” organizations. Since its founding in 1975, Partners has been working under the “livability” banner. Through its experience, PLC has come to see “Livability” as a broad term that includes many interrelated issues. Partners believes that “livability” should include those numerous and diverse issues that are currently being addressed on a daily basis by the organizations featured in this directory.

This directory is a collection of leading organizations, listed alphabetically, working in a variety of fields that Partners believes exemplify the diverse aspects of “livability.” The issues they address under the banner of livability range from jobs, people, and place to leadership and finance. These organizations are as diverse as the issues they address; however, they are organized through their focus on either, people, place, leadership, or finances, and through the physical area in which they operate. The directory includes representation from the for-profit, non-profit, philanthropic, and public agencies sectors.

This directory is a resource guide of organizations that communities can contact as a reference to increase their “livability.” In light of recent meetings of the Livability Coalition, the directory seeks to create a network of organizations which can provide a base for an aging-in-place agenda. Partners for Livable Communities would like to thank each of the organizations featured for their valuable contribution to livability.

Livability Today

“Livability” arose to the national fore in 1977 when President Carter introduced the “Livability Cities Act” as a component of his National Urban Policy. The Act proposed to recreate, under the Department of Housing and Urban Development, an extremely successful National Endowment for the Arts Program that used arts and cultural small “jump start” grants to help energize community changes.

On April 25, 2000, the first meeting was held of the Livability Coalition; a group sponsored by Partners for Livable Communities. During this meeting, the Coalition decided that they would act to pursue an agenda that focused on how the growing elderly population fit into attempts at community revitalization. The Coalition decided that this aging-in-place agenda would focus its attention on retrofitting, redesigning, re-planning, and rethinking community initiatives to better accommodate elderly individuals. The Livability Coalition was especially able to rationalize and pursue this new agenda because it remained a partnership of diverse members from county, municipal, neighborhood, and state-based organizations.

It was agreed, at this meeting of the Livability Coalition, that the aging-in-place strategy would incorporate the following aspects:

- *Universal elements of design, facilitated through zoning modifications, which allow for the design of accessible apartments and shared housing facilities amongst the elderly.*
- *Community involvement in the design process as it relates to external design elements for the elderly. Those who speak on behalf of planning and design for the elderly must involve the elderly in the process.*
- *Federal expenditures for civic spaces and infrastructure that recognize the elderly.*
- *Strategic redirected investment in elder places which builds on the premise that places that are livable for the elderly are livable for everyone.*
- *Recognition and accommodation of the diverse aging populations, which reflect the changing ethnic make-up of the country.*

Though many of these strategies were designed for the benefit of the elderly population, an aging-in-place agenda provides support for the revitalization of the larger community as well. As discussed at the initial meeting, this agenda would help to foster inter-generational contact. Additionally, an all-encompassing agenda, such as this, focuses public discourse on issues, such as culture, affordable housing, transportation, economic development, and health care, which are pertinent to all individuals. Growing out of this initial meeting, Partners has updated and redesigned its Livability Directory. Aside from providing a clearinghouse on community revitalization organizations, the Livability Directory now serves as network base for organizations implementing aging-in-place strategies.
